An update from the Nympsfield Community Pub Group

As many of you will be aware, the Nympsfield Community Pub Group (registered as a Community Benefit Society, 'Nympsfield Community Pub Limited'), was established by Nympsfield residents in April 2024 with the aim of acquiring the Rose & Crown Inn and operating it as a community-owned pub for the benefit of both the immediate and wider community.

Pop Up Pub Event

On Saturday 18 May, our 'Pop Up Pub' event saw the usually empty Rose & Crown Inn car park transformed into a lively hub of activity. Thank you again to the more than 300 people who came along to show their support and raise vital funds to preserve our much-loved village pub! And a special thanks to all the village institutions and local businesses that helped make the day possible!

The money raised at the event has gone towards funding activities, such as a bat survey, that are required to secure the purchase of the pub and ensure its place as a central part of village life for generations to come.

Purchase of the Rose & Crown Inn

We received an independent valuation report for the pub in May. As well as valuing the property, the report analysed the business potential and concluded that the pub can be run as a sustainable business. We are in regular contact with the owner to finalise a purchase price informed by the valuation report.

Grant Funding

In June, we received a £10,000 'Reach' grant from the Social Investment Business Group. This grant will support the launch of our community share offer, including development of our share offer prospectus, assessment for the community share standard mark and further ecological surveys.

In May, we also received a £500 grant from Nympsfield Parish Council to support upfront costs for fundraising events like the Pop Up Pub. Thank you Nympsfield Parish Council!

We had been preparing our application for a £300,000 grant from the Government's Community Ownership Fund (COF) but, due to the upcoming general election, this funding has been put on hold. Whilst we wait to hear about COF, we have identified and applied for a number of other grants.

Business Plan and Community Share Offer

The team have been very busy over the last few weeks developing our business plan and community share offer prospectus. We should be ready to share these soon!

Upcoming Fundraising Events

Nympsfield Open Gardens – We are planning an open gardens event from 2-5pm on Sunday 4 August. We will share more information on this event soon but in the meantime if you would like to open your garden for the event please contact Nympsfield.community.pub.events@gmail.com or speak to Jo Beeston.

Promises Auction – We will be holding a promises auction on Saturday 9 November at the Nympsfield Village Hall. Promises could include offering to bake a cake each month for a year, washing someone's car, a night in a holiday home, sports or language lessons, help with gardening etc.

From the Village Hall Trustees

VILLAGE HALL TREASURER

Brian has been the Treasurer for the Village Hall over 20 years, and now feels it is time he stepped aside to give someone else the opportunity to serve the community in this way.

You do not need to be an accountant, nor have any previous experience of being a treasurer, you just need to be numerate and have reasonable computer skills.

Brian is giving plenty of notice, he will stay up to the end of December if necessary (but no longer), so he will give full training to his replacement and work with them for several months so the handover is as smooth as possible. Village Hall Development Update

Following the failed bid for COF funding in XXXX the trustees decided to reduce the scale of the redevelopment so that we work with the current building. It was clear that we would struggle to get the amount of funding we required for the full scale development and the new design provides the minimum of what we require at approximately 50% of the cost. The new plans cover:

- Restructuring the kitchen to include a new roof, new windows, new units, constant hot water etc
- Strip the walls in the toilets and fit new cubicles providing disabled toilet facilities
- Provide accessibility ramps and widen doorways making access easier for wheel chairs
- Installing a sustainable heat source and insulating the main hall
- Provide a secure storage for the tables and chairs etc currently stored in the hall.

We are in the process of making an application for COF funding and have the support of an expert fund raiser.

Village Hall On-line Booking System

GENERAL ELECTION

The general election is on 4 July.

The UK Government has introduced a requirement for registered electors to show photo ID when voting at a polling station. All electors will be required to present a government approved photo ID document at the polling station in order to be issued with a ballot paper. Residents are urged to make sure they are ready to vote by checking they have an accepted form of ID (whether or not you regard this as a Tory plot to disenfranchise younger voters who may be disinclined to vote for them).

The most common forms of photo ID are permitted e.g., photo driving licence, passport, and some concessionary travel passes, such as an older person's bus pass (but **NOT** young people's travel passes, discount cards or student ID). Voters will be able to use expired ID if they are still recognisable from the photo. Only original documents are accepted. Further details and a full list of acceptable forms of ID are included on the Council's website at www.stroud.gov.uk/council-and-democracy/elections/voter-id.

(One can also apply for a certificate from the council if you don't have photo ID, but you're too late for this election).

Anthea Dove 1930-2024

Anthea and Chris Dove arrived in Nympsfield from London in January 1963 with their 4 children. They had spent a year in Ealing on their return from Kerala, India, and on Chris's new job being based in Avonmouth Docks, wished to live in a Cotswold village with a Catholic church and primary school, within commutable distance. The family of 6 moved into the 2 bedroomed Church Cottage, but by the time Anthea was pregnant with Ben, in 1964, it was obvious that they would need to move into a larger house. Despite Ben's tragic early death, aged 5 months, Robins Hill was built and the family moved in, in October 1965. and the family was then enlarged in 1972, when Peter, Chris and Anthea's last child, was adopted.

Around 1967 Anthea was employed at St Joseph's Primary school as a classroom teacher, for the first time, and did a second stint at the school around 1975. She would later remember her embarrassment at having to admit, in front of everyone, when Sister Catherine, then headteacher, publically criticised, in front of the assembled school, the irresponsibility of the footballers for having damaged the new tarmacked playground with their studs, that it would have been her fault, with her stiletto heels.

Both Anthea and Chris were regular members of the Catholic Church, but also believed strongly in the union of all Christian Churches and Anthea wrote many services that could be shared by both Anglican and Catholic congregations.

Anthea had always written short stories for family amusement and now had a lot of fun writing pantomimes that were performed every Christmas time. She cleverly adapted old staples to fit village stories and characters, and to the great amusement of all, gently mocked and parodied village and world affairs. She would later publish around 20 books and booklets, mostly on interpretations of gospel teachings, but also with themes of the environment and asylum seekers, both issues about which she felt very strongly.

In March 1979, their 4 older children all having left home, Anthea, Chris and Peter made their third and final move within Nympsfield, when they moved into Barberi Cottage. They remained there for seven years until 1986 when Chris and Anthea moved to Hengrave Hall just outside Bury St Edmunds. After 4 years living in Hengrave's ecumenical religious community they made their final move, to Whitby, where they remained. Anthea died, peacefully in her sleep, on 4 May 2024, the day after their 69th wedding anniversary. She was predeceased by Ben in 1965, and by Peter in 2019 and is survived by Chris, and four children, eight grandchildren and 8 eight great grandchildren.

Nature Watch by "Miss Daisy"

Oilseed Rape

I don't think any one of us can have failed to be cheered by the glorious sight of the yellow oilseed rape flower against the backdrop of a bright blue sky and contrasting with the green of surrounding hills. Some of the fields have been spectacular this year. But what is oilseed rape?

Farmers use it as a rotation crop and it is part of the brassicaceau (mustard or cabbage family) and it is the third largest source of vegetable oil in the world. The seed pods are green (ripening to brown), and the seeds, from which the oil is made- by simply pressing them - are round and black when the crop is harvested. This is usually around mid July. It is also used for the production of diesel fuel and for high protein animal feed, so a very useful crop indeed.

Plants from the brassica family (including the rapeseed) were cultivated as early as ten thousand years ago.

However, the oil yield for 2020 was one of the lowest in this century, and this is due to farmers being less able to control pests such as the cabbage stem flea beetle, and also because of warmer winters.

As you might expect honeybees are greatly attracted to the flower of the oilseed rape, but some people say they do not like the resultant honey as it has a slight

peppery taste. It does however have a lot of health-giving properties – one of which is that it is good for the bones, and therefore often prescribed in the treatment of osteoporosis. (You can buy it online and try it for yourself!)

Interestingly, rapeseed oil is often used in cosmetics, such as lipgloss and mascara – and for the men reading this – it is used as a solvent for oil-based paints.

Something to think about next year, when we are cheered once again by those beautiful undulating fields of bright yellow.

NYMPFIELD PARISH COUNCIL

A grant has been awarded to the Community Pub Group to aid with start-up costs associated with the bid to acquire the pub. The ‘pop up’ pub event was very well attended and was a further demonstration of the support behind the project.

On the planning front, there have been two applications to prune trees in the village, one for internal alterations and one for a change of materials for a rear extension, to all of which NPC have made no objection.

The village litter pick produced an impressive pile of filled black bags on the Barrow, which thankfully were removed the following day by Stroud DC. A big thank you to all who volunteered their time and to the Nympsfield Club for providing a really good (and free) bbq – a much-appreciated gesture. [Ed. Thanks also to Robert Morgan and Juliet for their litter-picking activities]
